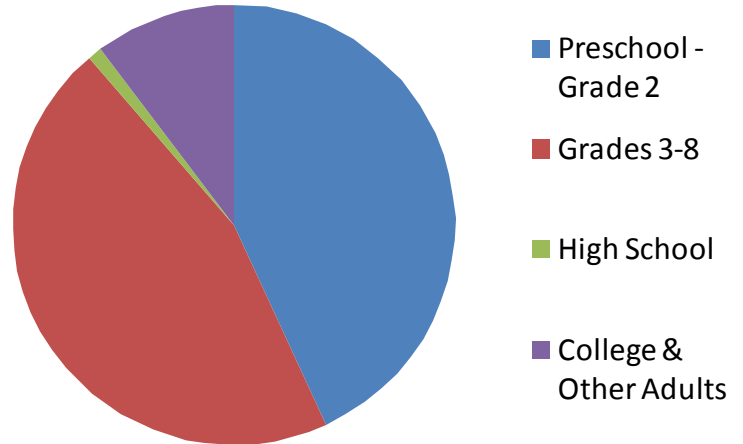

*Disclosures indicate that a student revealed an incident of sexual abuse during a program. Red Flags are when students exhibit behavior during a program that requires further attention. The Rape Crisis Center works with school officials and the Department of Social Services to make sure all students who experience sexual violence receive services.

Our Program Audience
