



Community Education Intern

Position Description

The Orange County Rape Crisis Center's mission is to stop sexual violence and its impact through support, education, and advocacy. We envision a just and equitable world free of sexual violence and all other forms of oppression. Our values include professionalism, excellence, accessibility, social justice, community involvement, self-care, and empowerment.

The Community Education Intern position:

1. Is a temporary, part-time, paid internship for the spring semester of the 2017-2018 school year (January-June 2018).
2. Will be paid on a contractual basis: \$10/hour, not to exceed 400 hours.
3. Requires 5-10 hours/week on Tuesdays/Thursdays. Morning availability throughout the week preferred.
4. Requires reliable transportation for travel to and from school programs in Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools. Mileage reimbursement for work-related travel is available.
5. Is open to undergraduate, graduate, or associate students currently enrolled in a post-secondary academic setting (i.e., college, University, community college, Associate's program, etc.).

Responsibilities:

1. Present educational programs on behalf of the Center, primarily in public elementary school settings.
2. Conduct follow-up and make referrals for individuals who raise concerns during Center's programs; this includes working with Community Education staff and school guidance counselors and/or the Department of Social Services when disclosures involve child abuse.
3. Work as a team member in order to achieve the mission of the Center.
4. Complete all relevant trainings and other tasks as required.
5. Assist with in office program support tasks.
6. Maintain appropriate standards of confidentiality.

Qualifications Required:

1. Demonstrated effectiveness in public speaking and program presentation, including clear communication of complex concepts to children and adolescents.
2. Demonstration of cultural awareness, sensitivity, and competency.
3. Experience working with people from diverse backgrounds.
4. Comfort working with and speaking of issues surrounding sexual violence.

Qualifications Preferred:

- Previous completion of OCRCC volunteer training.
- Experience working with issues of sexual violence.
- Experience working with school-age children.
- Bilingual in English and Spanish.
