- We present our programs to more than 12,000 children, teens, and adults in Orange County every year.
- We visit every K-5 classroom in both Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools and Orange County Schools every year.
- We present specialized programs to local middle schools about preventing sexual bullying.
- We recently expanded our program to preschool classes in the HeadStart program as well as self-contained Special Education classes.
- We work with school officials and the Department of Social Services to ensure that students receive services when they disclose an incident of sexual abuse during a program or exhibit behavior during a program that requires further attention.
